Introduction

The project aims at bringing together different national perspectives and challenges on youth mobility in the 21st century of young activists – students, journalists, civil and NGO workers, young academics.

We want to contribute to:

- further exchange and analyse of practice and experience, methodologies and approaches of youth work in the field of migration
- explore the opportunities provided by Erasmus + in the field of migration and youth work
- improvement of youth workers' skills in tackling migration and integration with young people
- development of an understanding of different aspects of migration and the relations in the context
- development of new projects related to integration of young people from immigrant background
- building of new partnerships between participating organisations

The seminar will provide insights into different types of national migration management regimes and EU migration policy. By examining the types of actors and institutions involved into European and national policies the seminar provides an overview of existing regimes and protection measures, economic, national and human rights rationale for existing policies.

The Venue

Project will be hosted in Angelus Silesius House. The house is located in the Wroclaw city centre, eleven-minute walk from main train station and main coach station, and sixteen-minute walk from the Market Square. You can easily get there with direct line from Wroclaw's airport (bus no 406). The most popular tourist attractions of Wroclaw are within the reach of a walking tour.

Travel Costs

The organisers will reimburse your travel costs from your home city to Wrocław, Poland.

Reimbursement of travel costs will only be done upon full attendance in the training programme and presentation of the original tickets with boarding passes and receipt/invoices.

Reimbursement will be done in EURO, regardless of the currency indicated on your ticket and receipt/invoice and up to the level set by the European Commission based on the distance calculator:

Travelling to Poland

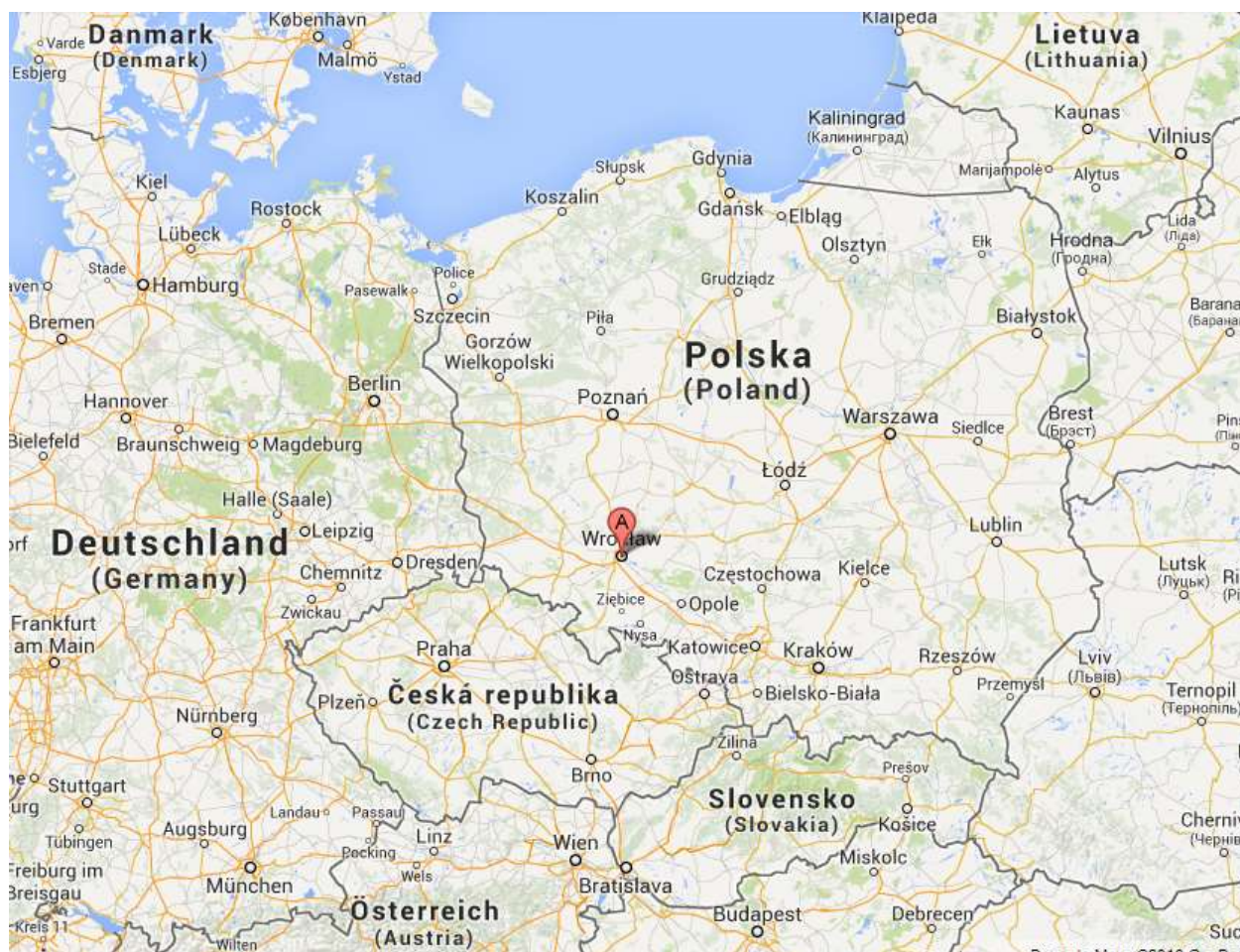
Wrocław is located in the south-western part of Poland and has many possible flight connections with other European cities (Wrocław airport.wroclaw.pl/en/). Other suitable airports are Krakow (Kraków, www.krakowairport.pl/en/) or Warsaw (Warszawa, www.lotnisko-chopina.pl/en/passenger).

It is possible to get to Wrocław by train (timetable here: rozklad-pkp.pl/bin/query.exe/en?) or by coach (for example www.polskibus.com/en)

As the venue has is conveniently located in the city centre, it will be our meeting point.

Organisers cannot provide you with accomodation before or after the project, but we will be glad to provide you with any information or suggestion that may make your stay safe, comfortable and pleasant.

Travel Budget Limits

Please remember that there are travel cost limits within Erasmus+ Programme. As a rule the cheapest travel option should be chosen. Those limits are based on distance from your place of living to the place, where project activities will take place (Wroclaw, Poland). Maximum eligible travel cost, based on the distance calculator is as follows:

Distance (KM)	EUR/participant
100 - 499	180
500 - 1999	275
2000 - 2999	360

What You Need to Bring with You for Reimursemenets of Travel Costs

- 1) Return tickets (e.g. from London to Wroclaw and back)
- 2) Photocopies of all of your tickets and boarding passes, especially if you fly with low-cost airlines, including the invoice (if you have one). If you've booked online, we need the FULL confirmation email of your booking, printed with the date and time the email was sent to you, containing e-mail subject and all e-mail addresses!!!

Please note that we will not be reimbursing any tickets in advance. We will also not be doing any bank transfers after the project finishes. All reimbursements will be done in Euros, during the project.

What to bring

- Information materials about your organisation, photos or report from former projects and other things, which will help you to present your organisation.
- Some national drinks, snacks, brochures, music for the intercultural evening.

Poland

National currency is Zloty (Polish Złoty, PLN). 1 EUR is approximately 4,25 PLN.

Weather in February is usually quite cold, temperatures may vary from 10 to -20 degrees with occasional snow and strong wind possibility. Nights are cold, so please make sure to bring some warm clothes, gloves and hats.
